We will be learning about...

During the next five weeks, we will start by reflecting on our mock exam from last half term in order to complete some CTG work focusing on An Inspector Calls, the Poetry Anthology and Unseen Poetry. We will also revisit English Language Paper 1 which will be our next mock exam, exploring, analysing and evaluating fiction texts and then creating our own piece of fiction writing.

We will develop our learning each week by focusing on:

Week 1 Key Learning: English Literature Paper 2 – CTG and English Language Paper 1 – Section A

CTG from Mock Exam (English Literature Paper 2 – AIC/ Poetry Anthology & Unseen Poetry)

Retrieval Knowledge: Recap of exam structure for Language Paper 1.

Knowledge: Read and understand a text; writer's methods including difference between language and structure; know the approaches to Question 3 and 4 and start applying them.

Skills

AO1: Read, understand and respond to texts.

AO2: Analyse the language, form and structure used by a writer to create meanings and effects, using relevant subject terminology where appropriate.

AO4: Evaluate texts critically and support this with appropriate textual reference.

Week 2 Key Learning: Paper 1 Section A – Reading (Questions 1 to 4)

Retrieval Knowledge: Recap overview of exam paper and how it is structured.

Knowledge: Understand a text; how to skim and scan; writer's methods including difference between language and structure; introduction to Questions 3 and 4; know the approach to Question 3 in particular and start applying it.

Skills

AO1: Identify and interpret explicit and implicit information (Questions 1 and 2).

AO2: Explain, comment and analyse how writers use language and structure to achieve effects and influence readers using relevant subject terminology (Questions 3 and 4).

AO4: Evaluate texts critically and support this with appropriate textual reference.

Mini assessment – Language paper 1, section A

Week 3 Key Learning: Literature Paper 1 revision - Macbeth

Retrieval Knowledge: Plot and character overview.

Knowledge: Revision of the main themes of Macbeth and some re-learning of quotations. Revision of the action in Act One.

AO2: Analyse the language, form and structure used by a writer to create meanings and effects, using relevant subject terminology where appropriate

Week 4 Key Learning: Literature Paper 1 revision – Macbeth

Retrieval Knowledge: Act One

Knowledge: Revision of Acts Two and Three, looking at key scenes from the play to build awareness of the changes in Macbeth.

AO2: Analyse the language, form and structure used by a writer to create meanings and effects, using relevant subject terminology where appropriate

Week 5 Key Learning: Literature Paper 1 revision – Macbeth

Retrieval Knowledge: Acts Two, Three and Four

Knowledge: Key scenes in Acts Four and Five and the resolution of the play.

AO2: Analyse the language, form and structure used by a writer to create meanings and effects, using relevant subject terminology where appropriate

Week 6 Key Learning: Literature Paper 1 revision – A Christmas Carol

Retrieval Knowledge: Quotation retrieval

Knowledge: Building an essay using the knowledge we have developed through homework this term.
