



## Year 7 French: Unit 3 - Where you live

# Topic(s) to be covered

This term students will explore the following topics: Countries and locations, where you live, types of houses and the house you live in, rooms, describing your house, furniture, describing your room, numbers 31-60, telling the time and evening activities. Cultural capital = mardi gras.

Students will develop their receptive skills by looking for cognates whilst reading and listening out for key letter sounds during listening activities (e.g. oi is pronounced wa).

Students will develop their productive skills by using present tense verbs, opinions, reasons and connectives in their spoken and written work. For speaking, they will develop their knowledge of phonics in order to pronounce French words accurately.

#### **Assessment Procedures**

1. Writing assessment – pupils will respond to audio and written activities on topics that they have covered so far this year.

## Homework guidance

Students will receive a minimum of one homework per week for which they will be expected to spend around 20 minutes completing. The homework will usually be to learn key vocabulary or complete listening and reading tasks on <a href="www.languagenut.com">www.languagenut.com</a>. If there are upcoming assessments, revision homework may be set.

In cases where homework has not been completed, MFL teachers may grant a day extension. If the homework is still not completed following this extension, this will result in a 25 minute after school detention.

## How can you help?

Encourage your child to download the Duolingo app which supports French language learning. Student can also use the platform on which their homework is set to learn extra vocabulary. Other useful websites include www.quizlet.com and www.linguascope.com.





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#### At Key Stage 2...
