

# GCSE Music- AOS3-Rhythms of the World



## **Prior Learning**

In KS3 music, students apply and develop a broad range of musical skills, which include performing, composing, listening, and appraising through a variety of different styles and genres. Students develop a basic understanding of different musical notations and keyboard skills.

## We will be learning about...

During this Area of Study, we will be studying a music topic called Rhythms of the World. We will be focusing on different characteristic rhythms and metres from around the world and the instruments and elements used for each place.

# We will develop our learning by studying the following each week:

# RAG Rate

### Week 1/2 Key Learning

- Knowledge: Introduction to AOS3- Rhythms of the World. Exploring features of Indian Classical music and Ragas.
- <u>Skills</u>: Watch video/listening examples. Famous Indian Classical composers works and instrumentation.

#### Week 3/4 Key Learning

- Knowledge: Traditional Punjab Bhangra- Exploring features of Bhangra music.
- <u>Retrieval Knowledge:</u> Identifying the use of music technology within **Bhangra**. Exam style practice questions.
- <u>Skills:</u> Perform a chaal rhythm pattern. Watch video/listening examples. Identifying **Bhangra** instrumentation and key features.



- Knowledge: African Music -Exploring features of African music. Watch video/listening examples. Identifying composers and key instrumentation used in this type of music.
- Skills: Develop skills by taking part in whole class African drumming workshop.

## Week 7/8 Key Learning

- Knowledge: The Music of Central and South America- Exploring features of Samba and Calypso music. Watch video/listening examples. Identifying composers and key instrumentation used in this type of music.
- Skills: Identify key rhythm patterns used in this type of music.

#### Week 9/10 Key Learning

- Knowledge: The Eastern Mediterranean and the Middle East- Exploring features of Greek music. Watch video/listening examples. Identifying composers and key instrumentation used in this type of music.
- Skills: Explore different metres and irregular rhythms.

# Week 11/12 Key Learning

- Knowledge: The Eastern Mediterranean and the Middle East- Exploring features of Israeli and Palestinian music. Watch video/listening examples. Identifying composers and key instrumentation used in this type of music.
- <u>Skills</u>: Explore different metres and irregular rhythms and key instrumentation used for each place.
