Prior Learning

Year 8 Music Rotation- All That Jazz. Students will have learnt about the key musical features of Jazz and Blues music, exploring chords, chord patterns and improvisation skills, alongside the history and origins of the Blues music.

We will be learning about...

During this rotation, we will be studying a music topic called Soundtracks. We will be focusing on different genres of film music and will explore the challenges and musical devices used in film soundtracks and composition.

We will develop our learning by studying the following each week:

RAG Rate

Week 1 Key Learning

- Knowledge: Learning Journey Overview.
- Knowledge: Introduction to the Film Music topic-looking a video moods.
- Knowledge: Exploring *Leitmotifs* and how they have been used to represent certain “characters” or “situations” in films.
- Skill: Case study examples- Jaws/James Bond.
- Skill: Chord constructions and learning the James Bond Leitmotif.



Week 2 Key Learning

- Knowledge: Exploring further Leitmotifs.
- Skill: Exploring advance keyboard techniques (flats/sharps/octaves).
- Skill: Perform a range of famous leitmotifs: Batman, Indiana Jones, Star Wars & Harry Potter using suitable sonorities and timbres from the keyboards.

Week 3 Key Learning

- Knowledge: Exploring film music in “Westerns”. Soundtracks.
- Skill: Focus on selecting different timbres and sounds to create a mood or feeling.
- Knowledge: Famous Film composers.
Skill: Performing The Good, The Bad and The Ugly theme focusing on selecting appropriate timbres to create a wild west mood.

Awe and Wonder Activity

Week 4 Key Learning

- Knowledge: Exploring Film Music in Horror Films.
- Skill: Create a soundtrack to a haunted house-focusing on the use of story boards and cue sheets.
- Skill: Performing The Tubular Bells theme- focusing on drones and sustained notes to create tension.

Week 5 Key Learning

- Knowledge: Exploring Silent movies.
- Knowledge: Musical spotting activity- focusing on Diegetic and Non-diegetic sounds.
- Skill: Foley Sounds project and Pirates of the Caribbean theme.

Week 6 Key Learning

- **CTG work (Closing the Gap)**
- Retrieval Knowledge: General overview of all practical skills to date.
- Skill: Analyse, compare and evaluate musical features and how they are used in film music.
- **Theory Assessment**

Week 7 Key Learning

- **CTG work (Closing the Gap)**
- Knowledge: Ableton Music technology tutorial project.
- Skill: Compose your own beat and making basslines using music technology.
- Skill: The playground- combining all composition parts together to complete song writing project.
