Future Learning

What will students be learning in the future? How could this unit help students in their future career?

Year 8 – Dance to the movies. Students will look at different dance styles from famous movies and will build on the previous dance skills learnt in the year 7 rotation.

Year 9 – Dance to the theatres. Students will look at different dance styles from musical theatre productions and will build on the previous dance skills learnt in the year 7 and 8 rotation.

Future Career – This rotation will help to build resilience and teamwork which will help students in the future. Students who are interested in pursuing a career in performing arts, whether that be as a dancer, actor, choreographer, stage designer or lighting engineers.

Homework

Students will be given a minimum of one homework every two weeks. They will be asked to complete a combination of research, written tasks and knowledge retrieval quizzes on the computer. Failure to complete homework will result in a 25 minute detention.

How can you help
