<p>What will you be learning about?</p> <p>During this scheme of work learners will explore health and social care services and how they meet the needs of service users. They will also study the skills, attributes and values required when giving care.</p> <p>This component will give you an understanding of health and social care services and will help you to understand the skills, attributes and values that are common across the sector (some of which are transferable to other sectors that involve interactions with clients or customers).</p>	
<p>Key Focus</p> <p>Students will need this key content whilst completing all of the component and learning aims. Learners will explore a range of healthcare conditions and how they can be managed by the individual and the different healthcare services that are available. They will then explore a range of social care needs and how these can be met by the social care services that are available.</p> <p>Student will need this key content whilst completing all of the component and learning aims. To be able to explain the impact that these obstacles could have on individuals and how it may hinder their health and well-being when accessing social care services. <p>Week 7 Key learning: Lesson (2 hours) <u>Benefits to individuals accessing health and social care.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To be able to assess the benefits to individuals and the skills, attributes and values in Health and Social Care practice. <p>Week 8 Key learning: 2 Lessons (4 hours) Practice PSA Assessment - Task 5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To produce a report on the barriers an individual could face when accessing services in health and social care and provide suggestions of how these could be overcome.
