

Year 8 Music Rotations- All That Jazz



Prior Learning

<u>Year 7 Music Rotation</u>- Keyboard Skills. Students will have learnt about the elements of music, basic keyboard skills and the early stages of reading and understanding different musical notations.

We will be learning about...

During this rotation, we will be studying a music topic called All That Jazz. We will be focusing on developing an understanding of the key musical features Jazz and Blues, exploring chords, chord patterns and how improvisation is used within the Jazz and Blues genres.

We will develop our learning by studying the following each week:

RAG Rate

Week 1 Key Learning

- Knowledge: Learning Journey Overview.
- <u>Knowledge:</u> Introduction to the Blues Music topic- learning about the history, origins, and development of Blues music.
- Skills Perform the walking bassline part. Analyse the use of 'Blue Notes'.

Week 2 Key Learning

- Knowledge: The history of the Blues and its connection to the Slave Trade.
- Knowledge: Chord and triad construction.
- Skills Exploring Primary Chords and Triads in the 12-Bar Blues structure.

Week 3 Key Learning

- Knowledge: Exploring Blues song lyrics using case study examples.
- Skills Exploring the Blues Scale and Improvisations in the 12 Bar Blues.
- Skills: Creating an improvisation and adding a melody line.
- Awe and Wonder Activity

Week 4 Key Learning

- Knowledge: Structuring our performances.
- Skills Ensemble skills and awareness of parts.
- <u>Skills</u> Exploring "In the Mood" combining chords, walking bassline, melody, and improvisation.
- Mini Assessment (Theory)

- <u>Skills</u> Exploring seventh chords.
- Knowledge: Exploring Swing Rhythms and Modal Jazz. Exploring Blues composers.
