

Year 7 Philosophy: Autumn Term Introduction to Philosophy and Bible Stories



What will you be learning about?

- •In this scheme of work, you will explore several Bible stories from the Old and New Testaments.
- •You will consider what Christians learn about God and how to live their lives based on different teachings.
- •We will link this to how religious people may view their responsibility towards others around them. Religious beliefs such as Forgiveness, Repentance and Love for others will be examined.

Key Focus: Introduction to key themes in Philosophy- Including parables and what we can learn from them.

We will develop our learning by studying the following each week:

Half Term 1

Lesson 1: What is Philosophy?

- -To understand what you will study in Philosophy.
- To know some basic information about the 6 world religions

Lesson 2: Beliefs and Facts

-To understand the difference between beliefs and facts

Lesson 3: Ultimate Questions

- To know what an ultimate question is and examples of them.

Lesson 4: Why is the Bible important?

- -To describe facts about the Bible
- -To explain why the Bible is important to Christians.

<u>Lesson 5: What happened to Adam and Eve?</u>

- -To know the story of Adam and Eve's fall from grace.
- -To consider why they acted in this way and what the consequences were.

Lesson 6: What happened to Noah?

- -Describe the story of 'The Flood'
- -Consider different viewpoints if it was right of God to judge human beings.

Lesson 7: Interim Assessment

To check recall of knowledge of the topic.

<u>Lesson 8: What is a parable?</u>

- -To know what a parable is.
- -To know that parables are used to teach people moral lessons.

Lesson 9: What happened to the Lost son?

- -To be able to describe the parable of the Prodigal Son.
- -To be able explain how the parable teaches about repentance and forgiveness.

Lesson 10: What happened to the rich fool?

- -To be able to describe the parables of the Rich Fool and the Rich Man and Lazarus.
- -To be able explain how the parables reinforce the importance of doing the right/moral thing.
